

Evening Programs at Clearpool

CLEARPOOL GUIDED

Night Hike- students will be able to experience Clearpool life after dark! Led by our education staff groups will experience a new world foreign to them through the use of activities and solo hikes. (Groups of 75 or more must be ½ the group at a time due to space). ***Night Hikes are only available September to May due to length of day.***

Campfire- one of our favorite times is sitting around the campfire and reflecting about the trip at Clearpool, and you can't have a campfire without s'mores! Bring your songs and stories to share.

Dutch Auction- gather up 10 items of your own (socks, pencils, shampoo) and join us in the dining hall for a fun swap and auction.

Game Night- if you feel more energy needs to be burnt off after a Clearpool Day, the gym and ball fields are open. Soccer, Basketball, and even board games are available for to enjoy.

Astronomy- this program differs from our night hike because we will stop and look at the night sky in full detail, on a really dark night, you can see about 1000 to 1500 stars. Viewed through a telescope, to enhance the program, we discuss the stories, myths and the legends behind the constellations.

OUTSIDE PRESENTER

Teatown Lake Reservation- *Birds of Prey-* Interactive and very informative live animal presentation done by our neighbors at Teatown lake Reservation. This is your chance to see owls, hawks, and other raptors up close and personal. (Can accommodate groups of 50 at a time due to the nature of the program, larger groups please call for information)

Wolf Conservation Center- *Wolf Presentation-* Entertaining and educational program that engages all age groups into the life, history, and present day problems facing this often misunderstood animal. This is a very special program with a lot of useful information.

Skip Earl- *Line Dancing-* Skip's use of movement, clear instructions, and atmosphere for fun is a key to this successful program. Groups of all ages, youngster to teens, will be moving and laughing by the end of the presentation.

Chris Evers- *Animal Embassy-* A truly passionate and informative educator that uses a variety of live animals in his presentations Through many of Chris's travels and experiences he is able to engage students and excite them with his passion for wildlife. Chris uses various reptiles, amphibians, arthropods, and small mammals as his ambassadors. (for groups under 100)

Andrew Simmons- *Endangered species animal presentations-* A wildlife lecturer with an amazing assortment of mammals, birds, and reptiles that fascinate the audiences, his programs are full of information and interactive activities.

Ninham Mountain Singers- *Native American History-* This group local to our area, and renowned across the country offers a glimpse into local Native American life and history, through the use of dance, stories and movement. It is a fun program that offers group participation.

Talons- *A Bird of Prey Experience-* Lorrie Schumacher, as a master falconer, demonstrates how these raptors are a vital function to any ecosystem. She has traveled up and down the east coast engaging participants in the wonders of Birds of Prey.
